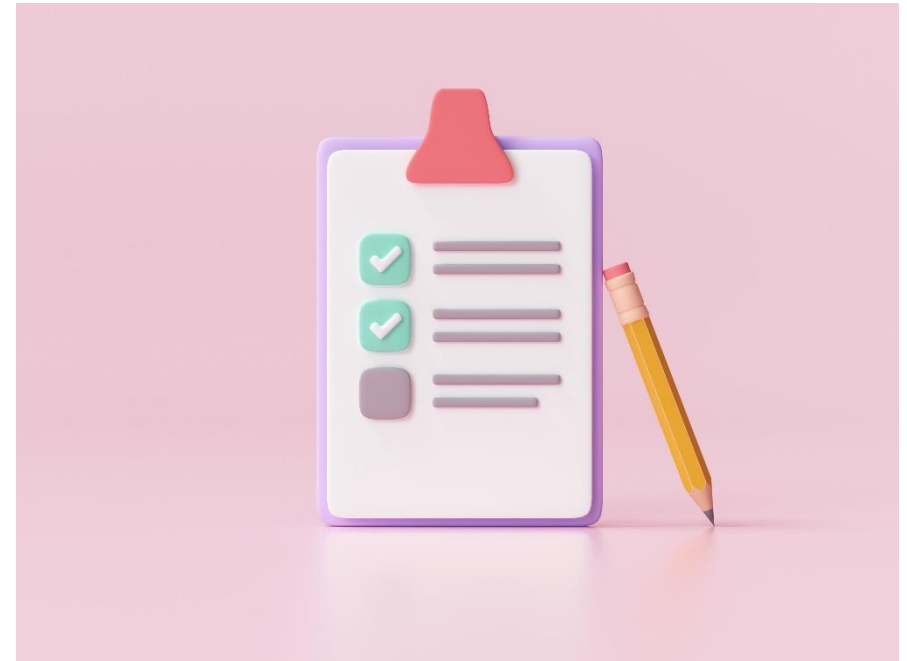

Top 5 Tips to successful referencing

1. Find sources that help to support your assignment.
2. Save a list of all the sources used as you find them
3. [Cite your references](#) in your essay.
4. Format your references to the [correct style](#) and be consistent and accurate.

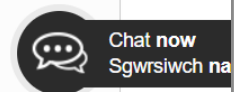
How to use this guide
